GENERAL APPLICATION INSTRUCTIONS

Complete the undergraduate application and return it with a \$30 (US) nonrefundable application fee, payable to Barry University. FRESHMAN APPLICANTS

- 1. Ask the College Board (866-756-7346) or the American College Testing Program (319-337-1313) to forward your official SAT I or ACT scores to Barry University, Office of Admissions. Barry University's code numbers are 5053 (SAT I) and 0718 (ACT). Test scores posted on official high school transcripts are also acceptable.
- 2. Ask your guidance counselor to forward your official high school transcripts to Barry University,
 Office of Admissions.
- 3. If you have completed a GED, have official results of that examination and your official high school transcripts sent to Barry University, Office of Admissions.

TRANSFER APPLICANTS

Request that an official transcript from each college attended be forwarded to Barry University, Office of Admissions. Student copies or transcripts stamped "Issued to Student" are not acceptable.

You should apply as a transfer student if you will have completed 12 or more acceptable college credits.

High school seniors with Advanced Placement credits and college credits should apply for freshman status. An evaluation of transfer credits will be made after receipt of your application and credentials.

INTERNATIONAL APPLICANTS

- 1. Please complete this undergraduate application following the instructions above.
- 2. Once we receive your completed application and application fee, additional forms and instructions will be forwarded to you.
- 3. Please request that the Educational Testing Services forward a copy of your official TOEFL (Test of English as a Foreign Language) scores to Barry University, Office of Admissions. The TOEFL is required of all applicants who do not give evidence of being native English speakers. For exceptions, contact the Office of Admissions.
